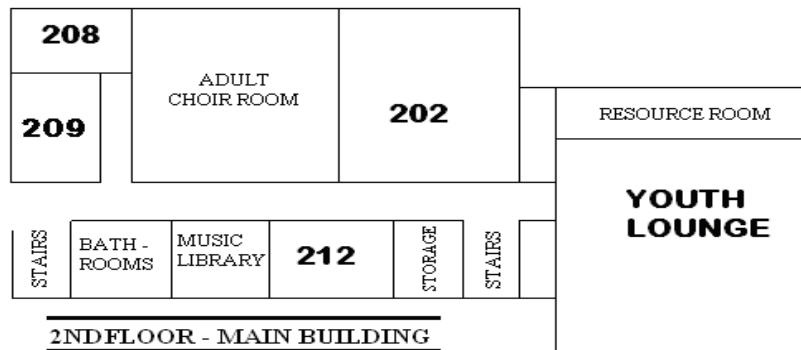
1ST FLOOR - FAMILY LIFE CENTER
